FOR THE BARBECUE-LOVER



Uncle Troy's Family BBQ, located downtown in the Fork Forty Food Hall, is focused on fellowship and connection, using family recipes handed down through the generations. The menu includes pork, turkey, beef, and chicken, plus classic sides and desserts like mac and cheese, black-eyed peas, and sweet potato pie. JoJo's Soul Food & Memphis BBQ. a food cart located at The Yard in East Salem, focuses on Memphisstyle Southern food, including ribs, chicken, mac and cheese, collard greens, baked beans, and cornbread. 

Epilogue Kitchen and Cocktails provides upscale dishes from the plains and valleys of the Mid-Atlantic and Heartland, including crab cakes, meatball subs, and ox tail. But Epilogue is also a vegetarian's heaven – try the carrot corn dogs (yes, carrots!), fried eggplant, and pierogi dumplings. They're only open for takeout right now, so treat your loved one to a fine meal at home, or pick up a gift card.
